

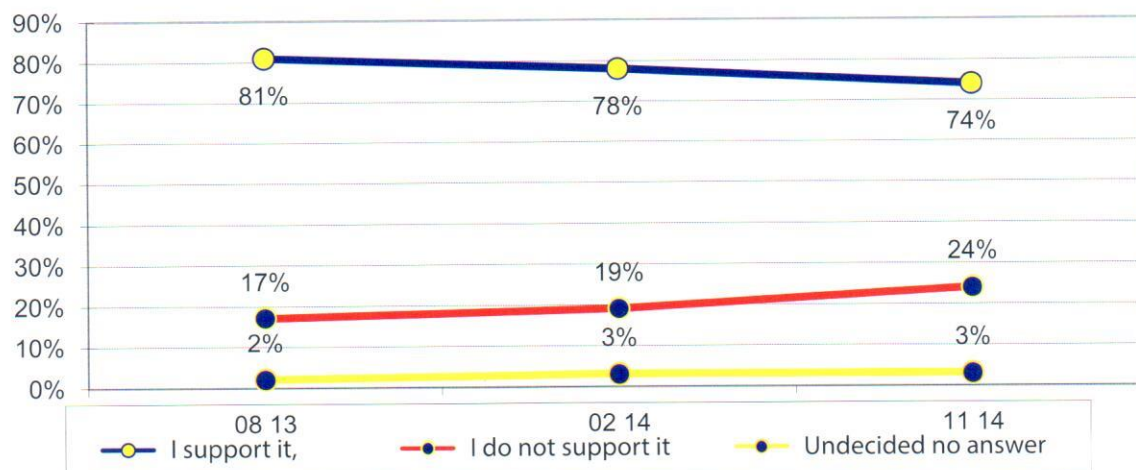
For the purposes of the Secretariat for European Affairs, three public opinion surveys were conducted on the Euro-integration process of the Republic of Macedonia for the period from August 2013 to November 2014. The research was conducted by Brima, in the field, in person, with a sample of approximately 1,200 respondents. The research for August 2013 and for February 2014 was financially supported by the National Democratic Institute – NDI, and the last research conducted in November this year was financially supported by the German Society for International Cooperation – GIZ.

The answers to the question ‘Do you personally support the membership of RM within EU and NATO?’ clearly show the predominant positive attitude of citizens in relation to the European course of the Republic of Macedonia, despite the slight decline, the percentage of undecided opinion is exceptionally low, which shows a well-developed perception of the public for the EU-Agenda.

In the context of the second question ‘Having everything in consideration, would you say that the Republic of Macedonia would benefit from membership in the EU?’ the majority of the respondents consider that the Republic of Macedonia would benefit from membership in the EU.
